Topic

Howwere the Mayans different from Britain during the Anglo-Saxonstime?

This half term, we will be learning about the Mayan Civilization and its incredible architectural, scientific and cultural development. We will contrast them to their contemporary Anglo-Saxons. In DT, we will bring the fun researching, designing and exploring with Lego Robotics. In geography, our key question will be 'Why does the time change?' and we will explore world countries and hemispheres.



Evolution? Prove it!

In Science, in term 1 we will discuss evolution and hereditary traits while in term 2 we will focus on animals and humans, in particular we will explore the circulatory system.

Varmints

In English, our units will be based around the wonderful novel 'Varmints' by Helen Ward. It is an engaging and beautifully illustrated book and film about one small creature's struggle to preserve a world in danger of being lost forever through recklessness and indifference.

We will cover a range of text types, including narrative story, narrative poem, Non-chronological report and poetry.



Maths

This term we will be covering:

- Place Value
- Addition and subtraction
- Reasoning skills

How parents can help this term:

English

This term the children will be studying a range of text types, including:

- Poetry
- Non-chronological Report



Preparing for SATS, we will also focus on Reading Comprehension and GPS (Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling).

PE, Health and Well-being

In the first half of term, our PE lessons are on a Monday afternoon with Mr Hughes. The children will be working on different fitness components to improve their fitness and working on developing their football and handball skills.

Homework

RE

Parental Help

Medicines and Allergies

If your child has an inhaler, we also require a named 'spacer' (e.g. Volumatic) to ensure that the correct dose is taken. In order for children to take any medication, parents must fill in a permission form from the office. Children will not be allowed to take medicine unsupervised under any circumstances.
